




CORA COMMENTS

DECEMBER C-O-R-A BOARD MEETING

The meeting was held in the Red Cross Building on 14 December 1977, at 19:30 local time. Twelve members and six guests were present.

Special guests LEE AKIN and CHARLES ALLEN (W5TKT) from the Oklahoma County Civil Defense presented information regarding the new CD Van which is now in operation. A brief review of the communications equipment, needed staffing, and general operations were presented with a request for assistance. It was recommended that these operations be coordinated through COY (N5OK) who is the recently appointed Oklahoma County EC.

A new policy regarding the mailing of Collector and Emitter was adopted by the Board and JOE (WA5ZNF) was instructed to implement it immediately.







MERRY CHRISTMAS FROM THE VHF CLUB

I would like, in behalf of the officers and members of the VHF Club, to extend to all Season's Greetings and sincere hope that each and every one of you is blessed with satisfaction, for satisfaction is the result of achievement. This issue of C & E is short because the staff is borrowing time to participate in season's activities. The club has no formal meeting this month, the normal meeting date is Joe, K5JB, Sec'y set for a party.

EQUIPMENT TEST - HUGHES PROBEYE (R)



As I mentioned last month, I was going to test an infrared scanner made by Hughes to see if it would detect heat generated in power line connections suspected of generating RF interference. Well, one cold winter night, I struck out with DF gear and sought out a noisy power pole. I found a couple of places where noise seemed to be concentrated so I got out of the car and started looking. I'll save the suspense - I didn't find anything.

The Probeye is a scanning IR detector which is cooled by expansion of argon. A small 5000 psi gas cylinder is attached to the handheld instrument. By cooling the detector, the sensitivity is good enough to detect a temperature difference as small as 1 degree F. By scanning, the observer is presented a picture of a scene, similar to a TV raster but more coarse. The resulting image is brighter where the target is warmer. Transformers on power poles appear quite warm but I only found one connection which looked warmer than the rest and I couldn't detect any unusual RF associated with it.

The whole research program was not fruitless however. Dave, K5WMY, and I were driving around scanning poles on the fly when I spotted something hot at the base of a pole about 100 feet away. We stopped and walked up on a possum that was too Joe, K5JB bewildered to remember to play possum!




MOBILE BATTERY TIP

By Dick Frederick, W4UGC


Install an extra battery parallel with the regular auto battery and double the Ampere hour rating. No heavy diodes or relays. Connect with AGW No. 10 or larger wire and use a heavy duty switch mounted on the dash. CAUTION: Turn switch off when starting car but switch extra battery in while motor is running and both batteries will be charged by the generator. Extra battery is nice if you operate too long with engine off.

B1 - Normal Battery B2 - Additional battery SW - Heavy duty switch


NEXT "QCWA" MEETING




