
Dick also reported that he and Don Duck, AE5N, bread-boarded and installed a controller circuit on the repeater, and are

As long as we are modifying, here is something off off the Packet Bulletin boards. (Routing headers removed):

R:871104/0526z @:WA6YBT #2494 ⊛Harrisburg, PA™ N:HBG Z:17109

I recently bought a new FT-727R from Yaesu. For those who were asking here is the modification for extended coverage. This will work for both the old and new CPU versions.

- 1. Remove the battery pack
- Locate the RAM backup switch according to your manual (this will be the switch FARTHEST away from the battery terminals)
- Turn the switch off, count to 4, then turn it back on
- 4. Replace the battery pack
- Turn the rig on. The readout should be entirely blank. If it is not, you probably did not wait long enough before turning the switch back ON, so repeat the above procedure.
- 6. Type in the following: " 001111 "

The rig should now come to life. You will have to reprogram all the memories as well as the repeater splits for both bands. The display will now cover 100-199, 400-499MHz, but it obviously won't work over this range. Mine covers 139-160, 420-460. The reset code will be "007777" (I haven't tried it).







New Battery

My latest copy of Aerospace Products contained a little blurb on the cover about a new lithium rechargable battery that has been developed by AT&T Bell Labs. It has high power (up to 4C, the 15 minute rate), long life (over 250 deep cycles) and the AA cells have 2 to 3 times the energy density of nickel-cadmium cells. It has a mid-discharge voltage of 2 Volts and retains 90% of its capacity after one year in open circuit. Looks like it would be real useful for my mode of handie talkie operation (once a year at the Dayton Hamvention, grin!) The system is still in development, but a small number of R&D samples are available for applications evaluation. If you are curious, contact AT&T Bell Labs, 600 Mountain Rd., Murray Hill, NJ 07974. Packet Happenings

There is a lot of nifty stuff going on, and you who are on packet are probably aware of it -- the addition of the UHF linking and cross overs between frequencies is improving the .01 situation somewhat. WD4LPU and WB5FWE bulletin boards are now accessible on .05 and that permits local users to get the latest news without clobbering .01. Good show!

Dave, WD5G, and I have not been running the TCP/IP except upon request. We put it on .05 because it makes winky blinky on some people's CRTs. The latest modifications to the TCP/IP make use of the Net/ROM networking, but I don't have the modifications. We still have not figured out how to make it any more accessable to the regular AX.25 user except as a simple terminal deal. It does have the facility of sharing files with the WA7MBL BBS system running under a multi-tasking operating shell, like Double-DOS, but I don't have the required second serial port on the computer.

There is a generic Net/ROM work-alike now available from Germany. Source code is available from the authors and will shortly be available here; however, it takes some contortions to get the code assembled and stuck into a TNC-2 EPROM. It is written mostly in C and severely munged over with optimizers to make it fit. Sigh! What happened to the art of assembly language programming?

I made a minor contribution to the local weather reporting activity by writing a couple of BASIC programs (one for Apple, one for MS Basic) to expand the compressed weather maps available on WB5PWY at the National Weather Service. (First wrote compression and expansion routines in C to see if I could do it and then converted the expansion one to the two BASIC dialects. I was told it was Steve Wolfe who wrote the one being used on the MS-DOS computers.)

The BASIC routines are easier than executable binary files to ship around on packet in plain ASCII. I found a couple of BASIC programs that convert binary files to printable files with only a 33% increase in size. If I have room, I will put them here. If not, they will be available on the K5JB BBS.

I issued a challenge to the Commodore owners to take one of the weather expansion programs and convert it to CBM BASIC but it has not happened yet. Again, if I have room, I will stick one of them in the column this month. They are also both on the K5JB BBS.

WA7UIB and N5DUB have put out their second issue of NODE (Net/ROM Open Discussion Editorial) and it looks like a dandy. If you want to learn all the hints and kinks of using Net/ROM, as well as keep up with the latest gossip on networking, check with one of those guys and get on the mailing list. Well, let's see what is in the grab bag here...Joe, K5JB

TNC2 1.1.5 with KISS

Last month, I mentioned how I grafted two EPROMs together to make a TNC able to run either KISS or TNC-2 code. (There was an error, by the way, chip select on the 2732 is pin 20. I called it pin 18 in the text. It is aligned with the 27256's pin 18 and I got confused. The diagram is correct.)

Mike Chepponis, K3MC, author of KISS for the TNC2 has merged KISS with version 1.1.5 of the TNC2 code. It is now available from TAPR.

TAPR will program your EPROM (27C-256) for \$2 plus a prepaid return mailer. TAPR has blank 27C256 EPROMs available for \$10. If you choose to buy the EPROM from TAPR, they will include the mailer and postage in the purchase price of the blank EPROM, but include additional \$2 for programming.

TNC2 release 1.1.5 requires 32k RAM in your TNC2. If you haven't already upgraded, 32k RAM chips and upgrade documentation are available from TAPR for \$20. TAPR's address is, Box 22888, Tucson, AZ 85734.

The "COSI" Switch

Looks like RATS (Radio Amateur Telecommunications Society) has finally produced code for the "COSI" switch. It is now called the "ROSE" switch and it runs in the TNC2s and clones. Here is an excerpt from the announcement I found on Hamnet.

ROSE X.25 Switch Update: 15 March 1988 (formerly COSI-Switch)

We have been distributing the ROSE X.25 Switch SOFTWARE by electronic and postal distribution systems!

Since February we have been shipping the early beta-release versions of the switch code. Testing has started in Kentucky, Indiana, Tennessee, Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Florida, Alabama, Texas, Missouri, Kansas, Maryland, Virginia, and the District of Columbia.

Overseas activity testing is also underway or about to start in the United Kingdom, Australia, Canada, Costa Rica, Columbia, Ecuador, Philippines, Italy, South Africa and Japan.

By the way we changed the name of the software from "COSI" to "ROSE". "ROSE" is the "RATS Open Systems Environment". The switch software is the "ROSE X.25 Switch". The Packet Radio Mail Box System (PRMBS) will also be referred to as the "ROSErver". These and other systems will comprise a "ROSE LAN".

The reason for the change is a bit involved, but it has a lot to do with a nice organization called the "Corporation for Open Systems". No hassle from them mind you, just a cautious move on our part.

The beta version mass mailing has taken place! Mailings are a BIG job, but we got it done. Folks should be watching their postal mailboxes for our package.

The software has been available for quite some time via dial-up xmodem

download from the RATS Unix system. This has helped to speed up the distribution process. The procedures for access are outlined in the file "ROSEU.001". This document should help you through the process. If you have questions please call Gordon, N2DSY or Nancy, N2FWI at 201-387-8896.

The executable software and support files will be made available on Ham-Net. The software is also available via dial-up (1200) with the xmodem or uucp protocols. Read on for more details. The source code is available at no charge for commercial Amateur Radio use only! Sorry, but this software is only available via the mail or from the RATS Unix system.

The distribution version of the BETA ROSE X.25 Switch software is called "ROSES.001". This is an archive which includes the HEX file for the TNC-2 (and clones) and a PC-based configuration program.

The ROSE X.25 Switch User Guide is available in the file "ROSEN.001". This document provides basic user instructions for the common user.

The source for the BETA code is available at no charge for non-commercial Amateur Radio use only! The filenames are listed in the information message that is automatically sent out by the RATS Unix system when a user dials up. Sorry, but this software is only available via the mail or from the RATS Unix system.

There have been some questions about our software distribution and use policies. Our software use policy is: Free for non-commercial Amateur Radio use ONLY.

Our software modification policy for non-commercial Amateur Radio users is:

You may modify the code all you want, but in order to maintain your right to use the code, you must send us copies of your modified software source. This does not include passwords and encryption keys. The basic policy ensures that the distribution of new features added by others is consistent. It also helps us ferret out bug reports from the field.

Commercial licensing is welcome!

Executable, source and modification licenses can be obtained for other uses. We believe that this approach will provide a major funding source for the network. Several well-known firms have begun discussions with us. This will help fund the kind of

network needed by the Amateur Radio Community.
